



Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program



The Homeless Prevention and Rapid-Rehousing Program (HPRP) is a program funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. The HPRP program’s primary focus is to prevent families and individuals from becoming homeless or re-house families and individuals who have become homeless. The services provided by the HPRP program include assistance with rental arrears, security deposit, rental assistance, utility assistance, legal services, and case management.

The City of Chula Vista has been awarded HPRP funding and has contracted South Bay Community Services to provide HPRP services to the residents of Chula Vista. In addition, South Bay Community Services has been awarded HPRP funding to provide services to the residents of National City. Residents living in other areas outside of Chula Vista and National City may contact other HPRP providers in the County of San Diego. To qualify for the HPRP program at SBCS, applicants must meet the following minimum requirements:

1. Live in or be physically homeless in either Chula Vista or National City.
2. Fall below 50% AMI
Example: a family of 4 cannot exceed \$35,100 per year
3. Be U.S. Citizen or Lawful Permanent Resident.
4. Provide supporting documents to demonstrate eligibility.
5. Have exhausted all resources, such as having applied for Section 8, or other benefits that may help with housing.
The HPRP program must be the last resource available.
Applicants must present proof that all resources have been exhausted.
6. Demonstrate willingness and ability to participate in case management services to reach self sufficiency.

To apply for the HPRP program, follow these steps:

1. Complete a pre-screening evaluation.

2. Completing the prescreening process will allow applicants to be placed on the waiting list for services
3. Once applicant reaches the top of the waiting list, applicant will receive an interview appointment to initiate full eligibility evaluation and, upon successful completion, initiate services.
